DEMONS

A whole set of percussion instruments are brought together, whose shocks and malicious sounds embody the devil. In an imaginary but very sonorous clearing, this diabolus in musica itself invites the famous Sabbath Queen, accompanied by a crowd of monsters, witches, puppets and skeletons...

At the appointed time, the wands perform several macabre dances and bear witness to humans' eterrnal fascination with death. For the pleasure of the audience, composer Zad Moulktaka lends himself to the game and creates a contemporary vision of Hell.

ZAD MOULTAKA COMPOSER

Born in Lebanon in 1967 in the contemporary theatre world, Zad Moultaka is a composer and visual artist. He started playing the piano at the age of five and moved to Paris in 1984. In 1989, he won the First Prize at the Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris. In 1993, he abandoned his international career as an interpreter to devote himself to composition and visual art. Trained in the discipline of the western musical writing but linked naturally to his Mediterranean roots, Zad Moultaka creates his own musical language. Noticed by György Kurtág, his meeting with the composer was decisive in the statement of a progressive original and atypical writing. His works are interpreted and appreciated throughout the world; he received the SACEM Prize-Claude Arrieu 2007 and the Critics' Prize, best musical creation in 2017 for his work UM sovereign engine of all things. His several musical collaborations include 57th Venice Art Biennale, Van Harentz Foundation; Sveriges Radios Symfoniorkester, Stockholm; Deutsche Oper Berlin; Muziktheater Im Revier, Gelsenkirchen; Neue Vocalsolisten, Stuttgart; Chamber choir Les éléments; ArsNova, Musicatreize, 2e2m Ensembles...and more recently, Hémon, Opéra national du Rhin, Strasbourg; Der letzte Klang ist der erste Blick, Ensemble Modern, Frankfurt; Requiem for a New World, Basilica S.S. Giovanni e Paolo, Venice and L'Orangeraie, Compagnie Lyrique de Création Chants Libres, Montreal. In parallel, he continues his visual arts practice working across installation, painting, photography and video. Recent exhibitions highlights include Totah Gallery New York; Dome Oscar Niemeyer Tripoli-Lebanon; Center Pompidou-Metz; 57th Venice Art Biennale, Sursock Museum, Beirut 2018, Suomenlinna, Finland; Nuit Blanche, Paris; Saint-Pierre-aux-Nonnains; Arsenal de Metz; Art Dubai and Palazzo Albrizzi, Venice. More recently, Zad Moultaka was selected from among 200 Visionaries by Maison Louis Vuitton, in order to create a trunk to mark the 200th birthday of its founder. In November 2021, he exhibited his new collection "APOCALYPSE 6:08" at AEDAEN gallery, Strasbourg, France and a visual and sound installation "WAHM" Corridor des Illusions in China.

GILLES DUMOULIN ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



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Born in 1977, he began his musical studies at the Clermont-Ferrand conservatory with percussion teacher Claude Giot and then graduated from the Conservatoire national supérieur de musique et de danse de Lyon where he studied with Jean Geoffroy and Georges Van Gucht. He regularly played with Lyon and Toulouse orchestras and with Ensemble Orchestral Contemporain.

Gilles Dumoulin has been a member of the Percussions Claviers de Lyon for eighteen years, and since 2015 as an artistic coordinator.

From 2007, he adapted works by J.S. Bach, A. Roussel, G. Gershwin, H. Villa-Lobos, D. Shostakovitch, B. Britten, U. Choe. M. Van Der Aa.

In 2015, *Batèches*: international production with Ensemble Sixtrum (Montreal) including a new work from Patrick Burgan on poems of Gaston Miron.

In 2016, *Halla San*: works by Claude Debussy and Uzong Choe, with a commision to Arnaud Petit on a novel of Nicolas Bouvier (featuring soprano Yuree Jang).

In 2017, *Mille et Une*: staged show directed by Abdelwaheb Sefsaf, with actress Juliette Steimer, music by Patrick Burgan, new texts by Marion Aubert, Rémi De Vos, Marion Guerrero, Jérôme Richer, Abdel Sefsaf.

In 2018, Ravel transatlantique: a concert with pianist Hélène Tysman; works by George Gershwin and Maurice Ravel with music programme inspired by Ravel North-American tour in 1928. En blanc et noir: concert with visual artist David Myriam, combining transcriptions of Debussy and Messiaen's music with original creation composed by Denis Fargeton on a sand painting background.

In 2019, From New York to London: concert programme with chamber choir Les éléments that illustrates how the American minimal music school has proven to be a major actor over a large artistic spectrum. Caleidoscópio: a concert focused on Brazilian musical traditions with batucada Zalindê.

In 2020, Bertrand Belin & les Percussions Claviers de Lyon: two years after their meeting around Gavin Bryars opera Calamity/Billy, French singer Bertrand Belin reunites with the quintet on a specially designed setlist of his own repertoire.

In 2022, *Demons*: a programme mixing repertoire and contemporary creation, conceived with Franco-Lebanese composer Zad Moultaka. Gilles has transcribed works by Hector Berlioz (*Symphonie fantastique*), and Camille Saint-Saëns (*Danse macabre*).

Also, for the Percussions Claviers de Lyon, Gilles Dumoulin is currently contributing to the creation of two productions to come including one other commission of composer Zad Moultaka:

- **Aber-Din**, with the participation of Edinburgh-based Red Note Ensemble (world premiere on October 26th, 2022 at Sound Festival, Aberdeen).
- **Printemps** (world premiere in April 2023), a performance for five dancers from the French dance Cie La Vouivre and the quintet, with his compositions and those of long-time British composer and partner Gavin Bryars.

PERCUSSIONS CLAVIERS DE LYON

Created in 1983, the Percussions Claviers de Lyon is a five-percussionist ensemble based in Lyon, France. Recently renewed, the ensemble is now composed of Gilles Dumoulin, Sylvie Aubelle, Jérémy Daillet, Renaud Cholewa and Lara Oyedepo.

Dedicated to tuned percussion instruments such as marimbas, vibraphones, and xylophones, the ensemble produces an innovative and eclectic repertoire for their instruments that is always evolving. The quintet is constantly striving for musical excellence, reaching out to their audiences with original music creations, multidisciplinary performances, and collaborations with renowned bands and musicians like French singer Bertrand Belin (*Calamity/Billy* – 2018, *Bertrand Belin & Les Percussions Claviers de Lyon* – 2021), Senegalese percussionist Doudou N'Diaye Rose (*Mix* – 2004), Afro-Brazilian percussion band Zalindê (*Caleidoscópio* – 2019).

These include the interpretation of pieces from the western musical heritage (Leonard Bernstein, Claude Debussy, Maurice Ravel, Darius Milhaud), transcriptions of popular music works (Scott Joplin, Chico Buarque, Jule Styne), as well as commissioned musical pieces by contemporary composers (Gavin Bryars, Zad Moultaka, Moritz Eggert, Graham Fitkin). The ensemble also participates in numerous cultural and education activities on tour such as conferences and workshops, as they do in L'Hameçon, their residence in Lyon, France.
